#### Introduction

The Chartered Institute of Arbitrators (Ciarb) is hosting the Global Diploma in International Commercial Arbitration at Worcester College, Oxford, in 2024. The Diploma is Ciarb's most prestigious membership training programmes.

The Diploma has been delivered in the heart of Oxford for more than two decades - during the pandemic it was taught virtually. The Diploma provides eligible candidates with the opportunity to undertake training and assessments that lead to eligibility for a Peer interview for Fellowship. Delivered by highly experienced and distinguished tutors, it involves a combination of lectures, seminars, and workshops, as well as ample time to network.



## **Diploma Structure**

The Global Diploma in International Commercial Arbitration (Oxford) is split into three parts.

#### Part 1

#### Law, Practice and Procedure of International Commercial Arbitration

One month before the Diploma, candidates choose and submit a general dissertation proposal from a list of subjects. They are then assigned a dissertation supervisor and submit a final 4000-word dissertation online approximately three months later. There are also two 1000-word assignments that need to be completed.

#### Part 2

#### **Law of Obligations**

Candidates must pass an online exemption test on the common law and civil law of contract and tort before commencing the Part 3 assessment.

# Evidence and Award Writing of International Arbitration

Candidates must pass an award writing assessment, which they complete at home and submit via Ciarb's online platform.





#### Course Fee

The course fee is £9,750.00 inclusive of VAT. Early bird special offers are available. At least 50% of the course fee must be paid upon registration of the course. The 50% deposit is non-refundable.

The full course fee is due no later than **31 May 2024**.

# What does the course fee include?

The course fee includes accommodation in student housing on campus for ten nights, from the night before sessions start, to the morning after: (5 September to 14 September). A selection of meals are also included in the course fee and will be provided on campus, in the main hall. This is an opportunity to meet and socialise with your prestigious faculty and fellow candidates in the historic grounds of a 300-year-old institution.

The course fee also includes all study material, assessment, assignments and exemption test fees.

# What are the entry requirements?

To be considered for the Diploma you must meet both of the following minimum entry requirements:

- You must have a minimum of five years' professional workplace experience as, for example, a lawyer, surveyor, accountant, insurer, shipbroker or similar. This experience must involve communicating with others, problem-solving, managing workloads effectively, decision-making and the exercise of judgment, and
- You must be actively involved in and have experience of arbitration (domestic or international)

### How do I apply?

In order to be considered for this programme, please send your full CV to magrawal@ciarb.org by 1 March 2024 at the latest. If you are successful in your application, you will be contacted regarding registration and payment.

Please note that it takes four weeks to review applicants' CVs. We will contact you if you are successful.





### **Next Steps**

Upon successful registration on the course, candidates will receive confirmation they are booked on the course. Initial dissertation instructions will be sent to candidates approximately four weeks before the course start date. Candidates will be provided with access to a virtual learning environment and electronic copies of material to assist them with the Diploma, together with a suggested reading list. It is recommended that candidates are familiar with the UNCITRAL Model Law and Arbitration Rules and the substantive law in their respective jurisdiction together with the relevant Act(s) and Scheme(s) and important case decisions (where applicable). Candidates should also refer to the recognised standard textbooks to supplement their study in their respective jurisdiction where these are available.

# After completing the Diploma

On successful completion of the Diploma course and all the corresponding assessments, candidates will be awarded a Diploma in International Commercial Arbitration. Additionally, they will be able to progress onto the Peer Interview of the International Arbitration pathway. After which, they will be eligible to apply for Fellow grade of Ciarb and take advantage of a range of educational and professional benefits once they have been successful in the Peer Interview.

Candidates are only eligible to apply for the relevant membership grade for a maximum of two years after having successfully completing the course and assessment.
